Other University Requirements:

- *Admission* - 2 years in high school or if not satisfied in high school - 1 year of college proficiency
- *Graduation B.A.* - 1 year of college proficiency

- A minimum of 15 credit hours between the 2 areas must be at the 3000/4000 level.
- A minimum of 15 credit hours must be completed through UCF. No more than 15 hours of transfer credits may be applied between the 2 areas.
- Courses approved for use in the IDS area of study are listed on our website, as well as on the degree audit.
- Only grades of “C” or better can be used towards an area of study.

Women’s and Gender Studies Minor (18 Hours)

Minor courses may not overlap with the IDS Area or the TransGRaSS Area.

IDS 4934 - Capstone Experience (3 Hours)

Capstone must be taken in your graduating semester. The prerequisite is filing your intent to graduate for the appropriate semester.

Capstone is intended to teach students to apply the concepts and processes of interdisciplinarity to the complex issues of today’s world.

Women's and Gender Studies Minor (18 Hours)

- Students will complete a required minor in Women's and Gender Studies.
- Minor courses may not overlap with the IDS Area or the TransGRaSS Area.
- This minor can be completed online.
- No more than one 2000-level course will count toward the minor
- Students may use course substitutions, internship, independent study or Special Topics credit toward the minor only with the approval of the program director.
- Minimum grade of "C" is required in each course used to satisfy the minor.
- At least 12 hours used in the minor must be earned at UCF.
- No credit by exam (TSD, military credit) may be used.
