# Before Your Appointment:

- Please visit our website and familiarize yourself with our programs.
- Please be prepared to discuss your goals (academic, professional, etc.) with our readmission advisor.

## Readmission Following Disqualification:

A student on Academic Probation is Disqualified upon failure to achieve a minimum 2.0 GPA during the subsequent term. A student who is Disqualified may not enroll at the University for two semesters following disqualification. A Disqualified student must submit an application on MyUCF for Readmission, supported by a letter documenting the reasons for previous academic difficulties, clear evidence of satisfactory academic performance since leaving the university, and plans for achieving a GPA of 2.0 or better. A disqualified student is limited to petition for readmission once per year (365 days).

#### What should you be doing?

- Clear any non-academic standing related holds that would prevent registration such as those with Parking, Health Services, Student Conduct, etc.
- Meet with an advisor in the Interdisciplinary Studies Office. <u>Request</u> An Appointment
- Submit an application for readmission to the Registrar's Office via MyUCF by the readmission deadline.
- If you have completed any coursework at another institution during your disqualification, please bring a copy of your unofficial transcripts to your appointment.

### **Establishing a Positive Academic Track Record:**

Applicants seeking readmission to UCF are expected to demonstrate a positive academic track record. Disqualified students must take at least 2 courses relevant to their intended program of study at an accredited institution during the semesters in which they sit out from UCF. We define academic success as receiving A's or B's in all courses attempted.

#### Please note:

Any Disqualified student whose UCF grade point deficiency is equal to or greater than 30 grade points is not eligible for readmission. For readmission purposes only, "grade point deficiency" is defined as the number of UCF credit hours earned with a "B" (3.0 GPA) grade that a student requires to raise his or her UCF grade point average to 2.0.
