Join a "Social Justice" Group Here! (Discussions will be "published" in this module after everyone has joined a "Social Justice" group)

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Throughout this module, students are working independently to choose and learn about a social justice issue that intersects with criminal justice. There are several issues criminal justice officials must react to during various decision-making points in the criminal justice system. Criminal justice officials must frequently respond to broader social problems in an ethical manner.

Criminal justice is related to several social justice problems and issues. These may include behavioral health, environmental justice, and housing/homelessness, as well as issues such as gender and racial justice.

In this learning module we're doing something new by letting students explore a social justice topic of their choosing! Yay! Accordingly, each student will join a "Social Justice" Group. The social justice topic groups consist of the following:

• Behavioral health (e.g., drug use, mental health)

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- Environmental justice
- Gender justice
- Hunger & Homelessness (poverty)

After joining a group, you will participate in discussions with others in your group to exchange ideas and information about the social justice topic.

- In the first discussion, everyone will share ideas of how your group's social justice field/issue intersects with criminal justice.
- In the second discussion, each student will select one ethical theory that applies to the chosen social justice field/issue <u>and</u> criminal justice.

you select. You have activities and assignments that build on and support each other on the same
social justice topic of your choosing. (See the Syllabus for more information on the assignments and
