Throughout this module, students are working independently to choose and learn about a social justice issue that intersects with criminal justice. There are several issues criminal justice officials must react to during various decision-making points in the criminal justice system. Criminal justice officials must frequently respond to broader social problems in an ethical manner.

Accordingly, students are engaged in an experiential learning activity. As part of this learning experience, students previously submitted a Worksheet for Learning, which stated their planned learning objectives, activities and experiences, resources to be consulted, and methods for assessing progress.

As part of this project, students are also required to journal about their activities and reflections. Journal entries are done for every hour of experiential learning outside the classroom. A total of 15 hours of service are to be performed. Entries are also made whenever resources (including, but not limited to, those listed on the Worksheet) are consulted.

Integrative Learning Goals and Definitions

This capstone project is an integrative learning experience. The AACU (2009) defines **"integrative learning**" as "an understanding and a disposition that a student builds across the curriculum and cocurriculum, from making simple connections among ideas and experiences to synthesizing and transferring learning to new, complex situations within and beyond the campus" (p. 1).

The journal entries are designed to measure students' "Reflections and Self-Assessment" in accordance with the AACU's Integrative Learning Rubric. "**Reflection and Self-Assessment**" is defined as "demonstrates a developing sense of self as a learner, building on prior experiences to respond to new and challenging contexts (may be evident in self-assessment, reflective, or creative work)" (AACU, 2009, p. 2).

The goals for you are to:

- evaluate how the civic service experience has affected your growth as a learner and
- envision your [workplace, personal, civic] future across multiple and diverse contexts.
