**INTRODUCTION**

Valencia College (VC), in collaboration with the Rosen College of Hospitality Management at the University of Central Florida (UCF) has constructed an AS degree in Restaurant and Food Services Management to the BS degree in Restaurant and Foodservice Management Articulation Agreement. If the programs of study described below are followed, it will be possible for students to enter the upper division in the Rosen College of Hospitality Management at UCF with a major in Restaurant and Foodservice Management (BS) without additional prerequisite hours.

### **University Minimum Exit Requirements**

- A 2.0 UCF GPA
- 48 hours of upper division credit completed
- 30 semester hours of coursework completed in residency (last 30 hours) at UCF
- Completion of the General Education Program, the Gordon Rule, and 9 semester hours of Summer credit (if applicable).
- Grades of "D" do not transfer into the major nor count to meet Gordon Rule requirements.

## AGREEMENT PROVISIONS

### **Admission to UCF**

Students who have followed the program of study and completed their Associate in Science degree at Valencia College as described herein and maintain a 2.0 GPA (not counting grade forgiveness) in transfer work will be accepted into the UCF Rosen College of Hospitality Management.

### **Foreign Language Admission Requirement**

Students who have **not** completed two years of sequential foreign language study or American Sign Language in high school must complete a minimum of eight semester hours of college level foreign language or demonstrate proficiency at VC. Students admitted to UCF without completing this requirement must satisfy it prior to graduation from the university. High school transcripts must be submitted to verify that the foreign language admission requirement is met.

### **Internship**

Students will be required to complete the internship requirements at both VC and UCF.

### **Immunization**

Students who matriculate at a Florida State University are required to provide proof of immunization against Measles (Rubeola) and Rubella (German measles) prior to enrollment.

### **Updates**

This agreement is subject to change by legislative action, the Department of Education, the Florida Board of Education, the University of Central Florida, Valencia College, or external accrediting agencies. The required courses listed under the BS program are subject to approval of the UCF faculty senate.

This agreement will be reviewed by both parties on a yearly basis to ensure the timeliness of this document. UCF will provide Valencia with an annual report on the enrollment, success rates, and number of graduates from the articulated program.

### **Resources**

Resources of implementation of the Agreement may come from either party, depending upon budgetary availability. No party hereto is obligated hereby to expand any resources whatsoever in connection with this agreement. No implementation of any portion of the Agreement, nor commencement of any specific projects, may be initiated prior to the written assurance of such budgetary availability to the other party hereto. To the extent any external funding is required by the University in order to implement this Agreement and funding for such purposes is not appropriated to the university by the Legislature of the State of Florida or is not otherwise available to the University, the university shall thenceforth have no further financial obligations hereunder. In the event the University does not have sufficient legislative appropriations to carry out any obligations under this Agreement, it shall immediately notify Valencia College of such fact and of such portions of this Agreement that may be deemed terminated as a result of such failure of appropriations.

### **Dual Enrollment**

Students may be dual enrolled after the completion of the Associate in Science degree, but must complete all of their last 30 hours at the University of Central Florida.

**TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT**

This agreement shall take effect on July 1, 2017 and shall terminate on June 30, 2022. It may be automatically renewed for an additional one (5) year period (s) unless either party provides the other notice no later than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the preceding term that it wishes to revise this agreement. If either party fails to follow the terms and conditions of the Agreement as set forth herein, the other party has the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice to the other.


