(This might be an entry level position, or it may be a position you desire later down the road. Your plan will need to plan how to get there, whatever kind of position it is.)

Explain how your code of ethics supports these items.
- 7. Identify three stakeholders in your life. Who are they, why are they stakeholders?
- 8. We discussed *strategic planning*. Using the Myers-Briggs, or the Strengthsfinder, discuss three potential strengths to build on to be successful in the position. Also discuss three potential weaknesses to fortify before obtaining the position. How might you work to improve those weaknesses? Include a chart something like the following to accompany the narrative:
