Exit Requirements

- No more than 15 hours of transfer credits may be applied between the two areas.
- Students select courses based on an approved prefix system.
- A full list of prefixes approved for use in each area is listed on the myKnight degree audit.
- Only grades of "C" or better and "S" better can be used.

Required Minor

- The minor may not overlap content with the Areas of Study. Minors are listed in *ITALICS* and are organized by which Area of Study they overlap with.
- Interdisciplinary and Multidisciplinary Minors overlap with multiple areas. These minors, listed in *ITALICS* at the bottom of the backside of this handout, can be combined with any areas as long as no courses overlap.
- Students will consult with the college, department, or school that offers the minor for advising.

Determining the Degree type

The degree type (BA or BS) is determined by areas and minor selected. Next to each area of study, (BA) or (BS) is listed.

If a student selects two areas of study with (BA), their degree type will be a Bachelor of Arts. If a student selects two areas of study with (BS), their degree type will be a Bachelor of Science. For minors that are listed as (BA/BS), the student is allowed to choose either.

If a student selects one of area of each, (BA) and (BS), their minor will determine the degree type. A full list of areas and minors is located on the backside of this handout.

Graduation Requirement

3 + credits

Bachelor of Arts degree type - requires proficiency through the second-semester of the college-level foreign language or higher (XXX 1121C or ASL 2150). May also be satisfied with appropriate test credit.

Bachelor of Science degree type - requires one semester of a college-level foreign language (XXX 1120C or ASL 2140) or a multicultural course from an approved list.
