NACADA 2023 Annual Conference to be hosted in Orlando in October

NACADA, The Global Community for Academic Advising, is hosting its annual conference in Orlando, FL. The conference will be held at the Rosen Shingle Creek Hotel from October 4-7, 2023, touting the theme "Reimagine the Magic of Academic Advising." UCF is well represented on the conference planning committee, with Joshua "JJ" Johnson (Military and Veteran Success Center), serving as one of the conference co-chairs. Other committee members include Jenna Nobili (Student Success and Advising) and Nina Leonard (College of Business Administration) as Concurrent Session Co-Chairs, and from the Rosen College of Hospitality Management, Vanessa Blackmon and Edwina Norvelus serving as Entertainment and Hospitality Co-Chairs, and Jamie Davis serving as Volunteers and Evaluations Co-Chair.

There are twenty-eight (28) UCF staff and faculty members who will be presenting at the conference. Some of the topics facilitated by UCF include major exploration, professional development for academic advisors, writing for the NACADA Journal, and working with various student populations such as transfer, international, and at-risk students. UCF staff and faculty who are attending the NACADA Conference will soon receive an invite to a NACADA Pre-Conference Celebration to be held the afternoon of October 4, prior to the official start of the conference. UCF conference presenters will receive special recognition at this event. This celebration is being hosted by the Division of Student Success and Well-Being and the Rosen College of Hospitality Management.

NACADA is continuing its annual conference tradition of supporting a philanthropic organization, local to where the conference is being held. NACADA has selected <u>A Gift for Teaching</u>, a local non-profit organization, that provides free school supplies for K-12 students and teachers in Orange and Osceola counties.
