ADVISING NOTES

- Additional electives up to the required 120 hours are selected primarily from upper level courses, with approval from an Interdisciplinary Studies Academic Success Coach.
- A grade of “C” (2.0) or above is required for each course in the core and restricted electives.
- Students must consult an Interdisciplinary Studies Academic Success Coach before registering for classes each semester.
- The two areas of study cannot overlap.
- State University System foreign language admission requirement: two years in high school or one year of college instruction in a single foreign language.
