ARTICULATION AGREEMENT Between The District Board of Trustees of Eastern Florida State College and The University of Central Florida

WHEREAS, this agreement (hereinafter referred to as the Agreement) establishes two Meta-Major Programs: Elementary Education (ELED) and Early Childhood Development and Education (ECDE) (hereinafter referred to as the Programs) in which an undergraduate student will attain an Associate of Arts degree from Eastern Florida State College (hereinafter referred to as EFSC) and then transfer to a Bachelor of Science in either Elementary Education or Early Childhood Development and Education program at the University of Central Florida (hereinafter referred to as UCF), (hereinafter collectively referred to as the Parties). Students who meet the admission requirements to UCF and admission requirements for the Program when the AA is earned from EFSC shall be guaranteed access to the Program. After completing the academic requirements of the two participating institutions, the students will have earned an Associate of Arts degree from EFSC and a Bachelor of Science degree in either Elementary Education or Early Childhood Development and Education from UCF. This Agreement does not preclude EFSC students from attending and seeking other degrees at UCF.

§ 1. Program of Study

§1.1 Participating students shall complete the following at EFSC:

An Associate of Arts Degree with a Meta-Major in Elementary Education *or* An Associate of Arts Degree with a Meta-Major in Early Childhood Education UCF will evaluate and transfer credit for courses completed at EFSC in which the student has earned a grade of C or better for the Early Childhood Development and Education program and a grade of C- or better for the Elementary Education program. No credit will be recognized for coursework with a grade less than what is required for each program (See Appendices A, B, and C).

- §1.2 All courses designated within the general education component of the EFSC degree will fully transfer to the general education component and/or the general elective component of UCF's Elementary Education or Early Childhood Development and Education degree program. Any additional general education or core requirements will be identified and evaluated in advance to establish whether the new requirements can be fulfilled by EFSC courses.
- §1.3 Participating students will be required to complete a program of study at UCF, which equals the number of hours required for the degree program being sought. Students who successfully complete the aforementioned EFSC degree programs must complete additional coursework in order to satisfy all the degree requirements associated with UCF's 120 credit hour Elementary Education *or* Early Childhood Development and Education degree programs (see appendices A, B, and C).
- §1.4 The total program shall satisfy all requirements for the degrees sought at EFSC and UCF.

§2. Admission

- §2.1 In keeping with its mission to provide equal access to its educational programs, Eastern Florida State College maintains an open door admission policy. Additional information regarding admission policies can be found online in the current EFSC Catalog and at http://www.easternflorida.edu/admissions/.
- §2.2 DirectConnect to UCF® guarantees EFSC AA graduates admission to UCF (consistent with University policy). Students should sign up for DirectConnect to UCF® before they complete 30 credit hours. Students must complete the AA from EFSC, meet UCF admission

requirements, and be accepted to UCF.

For admission to Elementary Education- K-6 certification with ESOL and Reading Endorsements; (appropriate for students interested in employment opportunities with formal K-6 schools that require certification), students must:

- Earn a minimum overall Grade Point Average of 2.5 at the time of transfer.
- Complete EDF 2005 Introduction to Teaching Profession course with a minimum letter grade of C- (1.75) or better.
- Meet the Gordon Rule Requirement.
- Meet the Foreign Language Admission Requirement.
- Pass all four parts of the General Knowledge Test (no alternatives or waivers are accepted).

For admission into Elementary Education – Lifelong Learning Track* (non-certification and no endorsements earned, appropriate for students seeking opportunities for employment outside formal, K-12 schools that do not require certification), students must:

- Earn a minimum overall Grade Point Average of 2.5 at the time of transfer.
- Complete EDF 2005 Introduction to Teaching Profession course with a minimum letter grade of C- (1.75) or better.
- Meet the Gordon Rule Requirement.
- Meet the Foreign Language Admission Requirement.

For admission into Early Childhood Development and Education: Pre-Kindergarten-Primary (PK-3) Track (leads to teacher certification with ESOL Endorsement and Reading Endorsement), students must:

- Earn a minimum overall Grade Point Average of 2.75 at the time of transfer, with approved provisional acceptance for one semester if GPA is 2.5 (GPA must be 2.75 by the second semester).
- Complete all Education Common Program Prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C (2.0) or better.
- Pass all four parts of the General Knowledge Test (no alternatives or waivers are accepted).
- Meet the Gordon Rule Requirement.
- Meet Foreign Language Admission Requirement.

For admission into the Early Childhood Development Track* (preparation for work with children, parents, and families in a variety of settings, with a focus on learning, development, and family environment), students must:

- Earn a minimum overall Grade Point Average of 2.75 at the time of transfer, with approved provisional acceptance for one semester if GPA is 2.5 (GPA must be 2.75 by the second semester).
- Complete Child Development Common Program Prerequisite courses with a minimum letter grade of "C" (2.0) or better.
- Meet the Gordon Rule Requirement.
- Meet Foreign Language Admission Requirement.

*The Elementary Education - Lifelong Learning Track and the Early Childhood Development Track are non-certification programs and do not require the General Knowledge Test (GKT).

§3. Program Management and Reporting

- §3.1 So as to assure the admission and academic success of participating students, UCF and EFSC agree to develop, maintain, and improve a Program management and reporting system.
- §3.2 Each institution will:
 - Inform students and faculty about the Agreement and Programs.

- Advise students about the University's transfer and degree requirements.
- Coordinate activities, monitor student progress, and evaluate and improve the Programs as necessary.
- List the Programs in the appropriate publications and websites of the institution. Exchange regularly updated copies of their general catalogs and any other publications, which may be helpful in advising students.
- Provide timely information about significant changes in the Programs that relate to the preparation of participating students.
- Provide any other information that may be helpful with monitoring and supporting the academic success of participating Program students.
- §3.3 EFSC will:
 - Provide the opportunity for UCF to participate in any EFSC Student Life activities and conduct student information sessions as needed.
 - Provide UCF admission requirement information to all prospective EFSC transfer students.
- §3.4 UCF will:
 - Provide matriculation data to the Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs/Chief Learning Officer and designees at EFSC through the DirectConnect to UCF® Interactive Data Reports Dashboard from Institutional Knowledge Management (IKM) at UCF. UCF shall continually provide any additional reports that become available during the term of this Agreement to the Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs/Chief Learning Officer at EFSC as they become available.
 - Receive approval from EFSC prior to publishing materials pertaining to this agreement.
- §3.5 Each institution will assess the Programs annually in collaboration with participating faculty, advisors, and students to improve the Programs as needed. A report of the assessment and recommendations for improvement will be provided to both UCF administration and to EFSC's Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs/Chief Learning Officer at EFSC.

§4. Term/Termination/Modification

- §4.1 The effective date of the Agreement shall be August 1, 2019 and shall continue for a period of two (2) years through July 2021 with an annual review cycle to ensure the Agreement aligns with new regulatory requirements and/or program changes at either institution. This agreement may be extended or renewed upon written agreement of the Parties.
- §4.2 This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party given at least thirty (30) days in advance of the Termination date. However, it is understood and agreed that any student participating in the EFSC degree programs identified in section 1.1 specifically tracked for admission to UCF or already admitted to Elementary Education or Early Childhood Education program due to the Agreement will be allowed to complete the Program, notwithstanding the termination provisions above, so long as the student remains in good academic standing and is making measured progress towards completion of a degree program.

§4.4 This Agreement is subject to change or modification by mutual written consent between the Parties hereto. It is understood and agreed, however, that this Agreement may be modified unilaterally by either party as may be necessary to bring it within the purview of the policies of either institution. However, it is understood and agreed that no such modifications shall negate the participation of any student participating in the EFSC degree programs identified in section 1 of this Agreement specifically traced for admission to UCF or already admitted to either program so long as the student remains in good academic standing and is making measured progress towards completion of a degree program.
