### **MINUTES**

**Wayne Bowen** called the General Undergraduate Requirement Committee (GURC) to order at **11:02 AM**.

The **March 28, 2024** meeting minutes were approved.

- **Kersten Schroeder is elected as chair and Elena Flitsiyan is elected as Vice chair**
- **Dr. King explains the charge of the committee and encourages the committee to be open-minded about AI GEP courses and how they would like to proposal/search in departments for opportunities for such courses.**

**Dr. Bowen updates committee on AMH 2010 and Golden rule math:**

- Students enrolled in fall 2024 at UCF in AMH 2010, or who completed it at UCF in summer B (2024) will earn black diamond/core credit in GEP 9. However, if they want to have this course count toward GEP 4 (which would also mean it will not count as a black diamond/core), they should work with their Academic Success Coach to submit a Service Now ticket to request this change. Students taking AMH 2010 in spring 2025 and later will earn credit in GEP 9; those who took it before Summer B of 2024 or will earn credit in GEP 4.
- UCF has changed its catalog to make it simpler for students to complete the Gordon Rule Math requirement, consistent with updates to state regulations. The undergraduate catalog now reads:
  - Gordon Rule Requirement:
    - Six hours of mathematics courses designated by UCF to meet state requirements for Gordon Rule Math.
  - GEP Courses Which Satisfy:
    - Any six hours of credit from courses in the Mathematical Foundation.

- On the GEP Approval Process: "UCF's Board of Trustees recommended approval of our General Education Program at their June meeting. Our program is now being considered by the state Articulation Coordination Committee of the Board of Governors. Hopefully, by the end of this semester, we'll know whether we need to add or remove courses, change course descriptions, move courses into different categories, or any other changes to our program. Once we have made any changes requested by the ACC, the full Board of Governors will consider our program in January or February. This will be an annual process and will mean we will have a longer timeline to make changes, as much as two years in advance to complete all stages of review at the institutional, Board of Trustees, and Board of Governors levels."
